India is at the cusp of heading towards the New Education Policy, 2019. The panel discussion on the pertinent topic "Higher Education in India: Issues and Challenges-A students perspective" was organized by the Delhi Reflection Group (TRACI) on the 16th of November, 2019.

The panel consisted of an MA student and four research scholars from five different leading Universities viz. JNU, DU, JMI, IIT-D & AUD. Panel was moderated by a Scholar from JNU.

Each of them came from various learning environments and from different disciplines. The overall number of participants was twenty-five. The reflection and discussion of the panel was wide- ranging - from the student's experience in the class/campus to politics & policies, from governance to deliberating the purpose of education to the calling to minister to the University. Last but not the least, as a result of an overwhelming response from the TRACI reflection community we have agreed to have one more meeting, on the same theme.

TRACI continues to engage in theological reflections on relevant issues at various levels to facilitate meaningful and transformational engagements. 
